

**Jersey Law 8/1959**

**PHARMACY, POISONS AND MEDICINES (AMENDMENT No. 2)  
(JERSEY) LAW, 1959.**

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**A LAW** to make further amendments to the Pharmacy, Poisons and Medicines (Jersey) Law, 1952, sanctioned by Order of Her Majesty in Council of the

**13th day of MAY, 1959.**

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*(Registered on the 30th day of May, 1959).*

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**STATES OF JERSEY.**

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The 19th day of February, 1959.

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**THE STATES**, subject to the sanction of Her Most Excellent Majesty in Council, have adopted the following Law : -

**ARTICLE 1**

(1) For paragraph (2) of Article 2 of the Pharmacy, Poisons and Medicines (Jersey) Law, 1952,<sup>1</sup> as amended,<sup>2</sup> (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Law”) there shall be substituted the following paragraph—

“(2) No person shall be registered as a pharmacist in pursuance of this Law unless he is duly registered as a pharmaceutical chemist in pursuance of the Pharmacy Act, 1954 (2 & 3 Eliz. 2, c. 61).”

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(2) For sub-paragraph (a)(i) of paragraph (1) of Article 3 of the principal Law, there shall be substituted the following sub-paragraph –

“(a) (i) a copy of the last official edition of the Annual Register of Pharmaceutical Chemists published in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Pharmacy Act, 1954 ; and”.

(3) At the end of Article 3 of the principal Law,<sup>3</sup> there shall be inserted the following paragraph –

“(4) Where, in any such certificate as is mentioned in sub-paragraph (a)(ii) of paragraph (1) of this Article, the person named therein is shown to have the qualifications of a chemist and druggist, the qualifications shall be deemed to be those of a pharmaceutical chemist.”

(4) In sub-paragraph (a) of Article 5 of the principal Law,<sup>4</sup> for the words “under the Pharmacy Act, 1852, or the Pharmacy Act, 1868,” there shall be substituted the words “under the Pharmacy Act, 1954, or under any enactment repealed by the said Act,”.

(5) In paragraph (1) of Article 6 of the principal Law,<sup>4</sup> for the words “the Pharmacy and Poisons Act, 1933 (23 & 24 Geo. 5, c.25)” there shall be substituted the words “the Pharmacy Act, 1954”.

## ARTICLE 2

At the end of sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph (1) of Article 16 of the principal Law,<sup>5</sup> there shall be inserted the words “and, in such cases as may be prescribed, is accompanied by a statement, in the prescribed form, of the precautions to be taken in the handling, storage and use of the poison and otherwise in relation thereto.”

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ARTICLE 3

This Law may be cited as the Pharmacy, Poisons and Medicines (Amendment No. 2) (Jersey) Law, 1959, and this Law and the Pharmacy, Poisons and Medicines (Jersey) Laws, 1952 and 1955, may be cited together as the Pharmacy, Poisons and Medicines (Jersey) Laws, 1952 to 1959.
