

# PEDAL CYCLES (AMENDMENT) (JERSEY) ORDER 2011

Made 6th May 2011
Coming into force 1st June 2011

**THE MINISTER FOR TRANSPORT AND TECHNICAL SERVICES**, in pursuance of Articles 3, 80 and 84 of the Road Traffic (Jersey) Law 1956<sup>1</sup>, orders as follows –

## 1 Interpretation

In this Order, "principal Order" means the Pedal Cycles (Jersey) Order 1998<sup>2</sup>.

#### 2 Article 1 amended

In Article 1 of the principal Order –

- (a) the definition "1971 British Standard" shall be deleted;
- (b) after the definition "1981 British Standard" there shall be inserted the following definition
  - "'1987 British Standard' means the specification for motors for battery operated vehicles published by the British Standards Institution under the reference BS 1727:1987;";
- (c) in the definitions "continuous rated output" and "nominal voltage" for the words "1971 British Standard" there shall be substituted the words "1987 British Standard".

#### 3 Article 2 amended

For Article 2(2) of the principal Order there shall be substituted the following paragraph –

"(2) The requirements referred to in paragraph (1)(c) are that the electric motor –

- (a) has a continuous rated output which, when installed in the pedal cycle with the nominal voltage supplied, does not exceed 0.25 kilowatts;
- (b) is not capable of propelling the pedal cycle when it is being pedalled at more than 15 miles per hour;
- (c) is not, in the case of a pedal cycle constructed on or after 1st June 2011, capable of propelling the pedal cycle when it is not being pedalled at more than 4 miles per hour.".

## 4 Citation and commencement

This Order may be cited as the Pedal Cycles (Amendment) (Jersey) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 1st June 2011.
